Which office did you start at?

When I first started full time at Rigado, I mainly worked from home. After about 6 months or so, I started going to the office more often. At this time, this was Ben's house and there were generally four of us: Ben, Justin, Chris C. and me. Sometime that year, Paul came on board as well. Not long after, we hired Donald, and moved to a real office.

What is your favorite memory from working at Rigado?

I think my favorite memory is this crazy product idea we came up with called Rebound (branded as R3BOUND360). The idea was that you could attach it to your body while performing some sort of extreme sport (e.g. half pipe snowboarding, water skiing, etc). You could then use this data to augment video taken with a camera such as a GoPro. We prototyped a case, hardware, and wrote software for it all in a very short time. The goal was to have it ready for CES. We would go on to use this “product” to pitch how awesome of a design firm we were. Rebound really helped land us our first big contract with GoPro.

Anyway, a day or so before we were about to leave for CES, Justin and I were hard at work on the software to stream the data over Bluetooth. Streaming the data would allow us to have a live demo (we hooked it up to a small plastic Kayak) at CES. But the streaming Bluetooth data kept failing. We poured over the code, added many debugging messages, and even turned to more sophisticated tools like a logic analyzer (common in the old days). However, no matter what we tried, it kept breaking.

Randomly, late in the evening, I decided to read through a type of document commonly produced for hardware components. It is known as an errata document. This covers all of the bugs in the hardware. As it turns out, there was this very minor mention of an issue related to a part of the system we were in fact using. Armed with this information we dead bugged (a very technical term) and super glued a crystal on top of the processor. After hooking it up, it all started working correctly!

Moral: Always read the errata!
